Hunterdon County, N. J.

On this fifth day
of August A. D. 1820, personally appeared
in open court of Common Pleas, being a court
of Record in and for said County, William
Danberry, resident of the township of Amwell,
in said County, aged sixty five years, who
first being duly sworn according to law, doth,
on his oath, make the following declaration,
in order to obtain the provisions made
by the acts of Congress, of the 18th March,
1818, and the first May, 1820, that he the
said William Danberry entered for the
term of three years on the 12th day of June
in the year 1778, in the State of New Jersey,
in the company commanded by Captain
John Heard, in the Regiment commanded
by Colonel Anthony White, in the line of
the State of Pennsylvania, in the second
Continental establishment, that he con-
tinued to serve in said corps until the
20th day of April 1781, when he was dis-
charged from the service, in Lancaster in
the State of Pennsylvania, that his name has
been placed on the Pension list, and dropped
on account of his property. - And in pursu-
ance of the act of the first May, 1820. I do
solemnly swear, that I was a resident citizen
of the United States on the 18th day of
March 1818, and that I have not, since that
time, by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed
of my property, or any part thereof, with in-
tent thereby, so to diminish it as to bring myself

within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me, nor have I any income, other than, what is contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and by me subscribed. 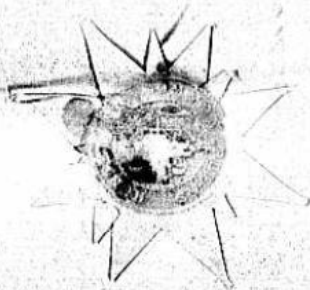

An affidavit of claimant has
unlawfully been exhibited, dated
4th Feb, 1825, stating that he has not
sold a sign or conveyed away
any property since the 10th of
March, 1818, and the reason why
he did not exhibit a schedule
of his property prior to 1st March
1823 is that he was advised
not to exhibit one as there had
been two or three persons who were
in possession of property, who
had made application and were
rejected on account of the same,
he therefore thought it unnecessary
to apply, he having some property,
affidavits of several creditors exhibit
stating sums due to this amount \$945.
Money loaned claimant to pay a debt of long
standing, time not mentioned \$160.
The affiant, Nathl Smith, states that he
is indebted to security for claimant to the
Trenton Bank for \$350. \$90 paid for
claimant at Trenton bank in 1809, &
sold him beef in Apr 1824, debt \$27

Judgment obtained against him
in May 1822, for 170 dolls. —
\$48. for goods sold him in Apr 1823,
\$100 due from claimant to Abm
T. Williamson, time of contracting
debt not mentioned nor on what ac-
count, the above amount of \$945
is stated by the affiants to be due
them at the time of making their
affidavits. Second neighbor
states that claimant is indebted
to many countries by two birds for
\$137.50 each, which are for land,
that he is very old, and therefore
desired him (being he agent) to make
the statement, it is not authen-
ticated. The affidavit of Philip
Dantony, to whom claimant has
stated in his schedule to be indebted
\$600. is not exhibited.

Claimant aged 62, does not
state his family,
According to the rules in this case
he cannot be sworn while he has
not been examined by a justice of the peace.
I have exam-
ined this case, and am of the
opinion that, according to the
principles which have governed
in previous decisions, the claim-
ant ought to be admitted.
